Course aims

To give PhD students and young scholars in-depth insight into key theoretical and methodological approaches to studying evolving and transmuting museum histories and

their implications for current museum practices. To train PhD students in oral scientific communication, inc. project presentation and discussant feed-back.

Course structure

The course will mix student presentations based on written papers, interventions by student discussants, and group tutorials.

Guideline for presenters

If you wish to make an oral presentation, please submit a 2.500 word paper focusing on the following elements in your PhD project: key research question, main theoretical framework, research design and, most importantly, two-three pressing questions in your current work that you want feed-back on.
